About us

About the role

As a walking befriender, you will support a resident in independent living or in our care home to get outside for some fresh air, encouraging them to be more active while enjoying some friendly conversation.

Main tasks:

- To meet with residents that you have been matched with at agreed times.
- To support the resident you have been matched with on a walk. This may involve pushing them in a wheelchair, walking alongside those with mobility aids or enjoying an active stroll with more confident walkers.
- To sanitise equipment before and after use.
- To report any concerns or problems to the Volunteering Manager or appropriate department.

We are looking for volunteers who can support residents on both our Blackheath site and Beckenham site. If you have a preference for location, please state this when applying for the role.

Training & Support

You will receive a full induction on befriending, boundaries and wheelchair safety. You will also receive training on safeguarding, health and safety and mental health awareness.

Due to the nature of the role and responsibilities required, you will be required to undergo an Enhanced with Barred List DBS check.

You will be supported by the Volunteering Manager who will ensure your training, induction and development needs are met.

Covid-19 Protocols

Morden College is a Covid-secure workplace. Volunteering activities are appropriately risk assessed and risk assessments are reviewed regularly. You will be given personal protective equipment to wear which is appropriate to the role. You will be PCR tested and Lateral Flow tested at the start of your volunteering session. The same rules about social distancing, washing and sanitising your hands and wearing a face mask will still apply.

As Morden College's work involves working with vulnerable residents, we ask that you provide evidence that you have had two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine before starting your volunteering hours. If you want to know more or are medically exempt, please contact volunteering@mordencollege.org.uk.

Expenses

As this role is based on site, you will be reimbursed for out-of-pocket travel expenses incurred while volunteering.

- Can commit to a minimum of 4 months
- Have some experience with older people, whether it be a family member, friend or colleague (this is not essential but is preferable)
- Have good listening and communication skills
- Are able to push someone in a wheelchair
- Are compassionate and understand the importance of respecting dignity
- Are reliable, honest and committed

This role would help you if you are:

- Looking to make a positive impact in your community
- Thinking of pursuing a career in social work or support work
- Looking to develop your interpersonal skills
